Dom. Frédéric Magnien, Bonnes-Mares GC

(£1,250 Je)

This biodynamic domaine appears to have coped well with the trying conditions in 2013. This is a comparatively forward, perfumed Bonnes Mares, showing aromas of violets and summer pudding. The oak is well integrated and sweet, and there's a core of bramble and raspberry fruit that lingers on the palate. 2017-25

Dom. Frédéric Mugnier, Nuits-St-Georges PC Clos de la Maréchale

(£525 J&B, HHC, HR, OWL)

The only wine that Frédéric Mugnier shows outside his own cellars, this was sourced from the first vineyard to be picked at the domaine in 2013. The tricky conditions didn't affect the finished quality of the wine from this, the biggest monopoly in Burgundy. Silky yet structured, this has flavours of bramble and black cherry, subtle oak and firmish tannins. 2017-25

Dom. Georges Noëllat, Nuits-St-Georges PC Aux Cras

(£700 FW)

Situated close to Aux Boudots, on the Vosne end of Nuits St Georges, this is another prime Premier Cru site. Its wines are more open than those from its neighbour: fresh and fragrant, with appealing oak, tender tannins and a fine, tapering finish. The sweetness of the vintage is very apparent here. 2016-25

Dom. Georges Roumier, Bonnes Mares GC

(£POA)

A blend of Christophe Roumier's two terroirs, as it always is, this is generally tasted before both Les Amoureuses and Musigny, and is never quite its equal. Dense and compact, at least by the standards of the domaine's other wines, with dark black fruits, muscular tannins and a fine, mineral undertow. This will need more time in bottle than the other two wines. 2020-28

Dom. Henri Gouges, Nuits-St-Georges PC Les-St-Georges

(£POA J&B)

The Gouges have a total of 1.1 hectares out of the 7 hectares of Les St Georges. This is a muscular expression of the vineyard - almost everyone makes a sinewy wine - that's compact, concentrated and even a little backward. But beneath the carapace of tannin (ripe tannin at that) lies a core of sweet, sappy fruit flavours and ageing potential. Classy wine. 2020-30

Dom. Heresztyn-Marzini, Clos-St-Denis GC

(£948 CF)

The top wine at this impressive Gevrey operation was given 35% whole bunch fermentation in 2013, backed up by a substantial 50% new oak. This is an appropriately serious red, with good concentration, ripe, but structured tannins, a hint of savoury spice and a bold, sturdy finish. Keep an eye on this domaine in 2014. 2018-28

Dom. Hudelot-Noëllat, Vosne-Romanée PC Beaumonts

(£600 FW)

These two parcels include some of the oldest vines at the domaine. Essence of the Hudelot-Noëllat style, this is silky, aromatic and deceptively forward with rose petal nuances, gentle tannins and considerable finesse. The chalkiness that breaks out on the finish is very pure and crisp. 2016-24

Dom. Georges Roumier, Chambolle-Musigny PC Les Cras

(£POA)

A wine that was a little closed and marked by oak when I tasted it, with a hint of reduction, but if you look past its youthful character, there's a chalky, refined Chambolle waiting to emerge like an actor on to a stage. Taut and mineral, with marked acidity and subtle red fruits. 2018-26

Dom. Ghislaine Barthod, Chambolle-Musigny PC Beaux Bruns

(£690 Go)

Ghislaine Barthod has made some of her most enjoyable wines for some time in 2013: reds showing perfume, balance and precision. This is still youthful, but it's a delight, all shimmering red berries, subtle oak and supporting acidity. In a year when it was tricky to get the extraction of tannins right, this wine is beautifully judged. 2017-25

Dom. Ghislaine Barthod, Chambolle-Musigny PC Les Gruenchers

(£690 Go)

A hint of good reduction, which dissipates in the glass, opens the door to a wine that is like a quintessence of Chambolle: summer berries, orchard scents and fine-grained tannins. Sweet, minerally and subtle, this is a detailed, nuanced Pinot with the crunchy acidity that is so typical of the vintage. 2016-24

Dom. Henri Gouges, Nuits-St-Georges PC Les Vaucrains

(2020-28 PC)

Grégory Gouges thinks that Les Vaucrains is every bit as good a vineyard as more famous Les St Georges. In 2013, the crop was a challenging 18 hectolitres per hectare here and the wine is correspondingly rich and powerful. The sweetness of the fruit from 50-year-old vines is balanced by the rigour of the tannins. Like Gouges wines often do, this needs time. 2020-28

Dom. Heresztyn-Mazzini, Morey-St-Denis PC Les Millandes

(£468 CF)

The second vintage under the new team at this impressive Gevrey-Chambertin-based domaine has yielded some excellent wine across the board, but especially in Morey-St-Denis. Racy and aromatic with 50% whole bunch fermentation, stylish tannins, and complex old vine concentration, it's a step up from the Gevrey Premiers Crus. 2017-27

Dom. Hudelot-Noëllat, Chambolle-Musigny PC Les Charmes

(£790 Go)

There are two parcels of Charmes at the domaine, situated at the same altitude, but of different ages. This is a darker, denser, more backward wine than the 2012 was at the same stage, with quite a bit of oak (it had just been racked when I tasted it), firmish tannins and flavours of dark plums and sappy, cinnamon spice. 2018-28

Dom. Hudelot-Noëllat, Vosne-Romanée PC Les Malconsorts

(£1,590 Go)

Charles van Canneyt's parcel is in the high part of Les Malconsorts, next to Sébastien Cathiard's vines. This is in a slightly awkward, gangly phase at the moment, with some raw acidity, but there's enough fruit weight and power for the wine to come together once it's bottled. 2020-28
