



## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Grand Cru 2015 Clos St-Denis

**Score 17.5/20**

*Cask sample. Slightly higher proportion of whole bunch (65%) and new oak (50%).*

Mid crimson. Restrained, lightly spiced red fruit on the nose - the oak barely visible on first impression. Shows more on the palate, which is fine-grained but quite compact. Feels a little flat at the moment but I think it is all just corseted up for the future. Very refined, like all these wines. (JH)

## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Les Milandes Premier Cru 2015 Morey-St-Denis

**Score 16.5/20**

Cask sample. Bright cherry red. Fragrant and almost delicate overall. Really very subtle, with the finesse of the tannins giving length to what is otherwise restrained; lightly scented mid palate. So subtle I may be underestimating it. (JH)



## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Les Goulots Premier Cru 2015 Gevrey-Chambertin

**Score 17/20**

Cask sample. Mid crimson. Spicy on the nose. Sweet-fruited and just a hint of stems (herbal), very slight. Dry, chewy and satisfying on the palate, perhaps a little more generous than the Perrière and fresher on the finish. **GV** (JH)

## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, La Perrière Premier Cru 2015 Gevrey-Chambertin

**Score 16.5/20**

*Cask sample. Mid to light crimson. More noticeably stemmy on the nose, though they have about 50% on all their wines apart from the grand cru.*  
Dry and dark-fruited, definitely in a more savoury, dark style, with fine restraint and elegance. Long, refined texture if not notably fresh at the end, though the tannins add freshness. Definitely for those who like the more stemmy style. (JH)

## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Clos Village 2015 Gevrey-Chambertin

**Score 16+/20**

Cask sample. Deep crimson. Riper and less stemmy than the Gevrey Vieilles Vignes. Some oak spice and sweetness. Firm and dry on the palate, attractive savoury restraint. Very different from the VV, and for the longer term. (JH)



## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Les Songes 2015 Gevrey-Chambertin

**Score 16.5/20**

*Cask sample. Two oldest parcels: 80- to 90-year-old vines.*

Bright cherry red. Looks so healthy. Subtly perfumed with dark-red fruit. Lightly and nicely dusty/mineral. Chewy, sweet tannins. Dry, paper-fine finish. Super-elegant. (JH)

## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Les Jouises 2015 Gevrey-Chambertin

**Score 16/20**

*Cask sample. Two parcels, vines 65 years old.*

Mid to deep crimson. Redder fruited than the Songes, ripe and sweet on the nose with light peppery spice. Rounded, soft tannins, could do with just a little more freshness on the finish perhaps. (JH)

## Dom Heresztyn-Mazzini, Vieilles Vignes 2015 Gevrey-Chambertin

**Score 16/20**

*Cask sample. More remontage than pigeage in 2015 for greater finesse. 25-30% new oak.*

Mid cherry red. Subtle but perfumed dark-red fruit and just a hint of stems (leafy). The dry finesse to the texture also suggests plenty of whole-bunch fermentation (c 50% in 2015, apparently). Elegant and really quite delicate. Juicy on the finish. (JH)
