The 2017 Chambolle-Musigny Villages comes from Les Echanges and Les Badoit, just under Les Amoureuses. It has a gorgeous bouquet with redcurrant *jus*, wild strawberry and blue fruit. The 100% whole bunches are brilliantly disguised and barely noticeable. The palate is mediumbodied with fine, crisp tannin, quite rounded in the mouth with a saline finish. The 25% new oak (from the Hermitage cooperage) is beautifully assimilated. *Bon vin*.

From 2017 Burgundy: A Modern Classic (Jan 2019)

Domaine Heresztyn Mazzini

Located in the heart of Gevrey village, Heresztyn-Mazzini is a classic case of a winery that contentedly sold rather mediocre wines for many years, until Florence Heresztyn and Simon Mazzini took the reins and dedicated themselves to producing better Burgundy. Heresztyn has existed since 1932, founded by Florence's Polish-born grandparents. She worked alongside her own parents for 12 years before rejuvenating the name and introducing better vineyard husbandry, including organic and now biodynamic viticulture, less oak, whole bunches and so forth. My only complaint was their rusty signage on their front gate, although that was then replaced and mirrors the redesigned label with its eye-catching violet hues.

"We started picking on September 11 and harvested over the following five days," Simon Mazzini told me. (Florence was away doing her own picking –not of grapes but of the kids from school.) "We did not add any SO2 until after the malolactic and just chaptalised a little. The alcohol came in at around 12.7° to 12.9°." I also asked about their progression in terms of organic viticulture. "We used organic compounds to protect against mildew. We applied them on Monday and I was not sure they would work. We came back at the end of Tuesday and found that the mildew had become completely dry and just blew off. It was amazing."

This is a fine address if you are seeking an alternative to, say, Armand Rousseau. Heresztyn-Mazzini is in the same mold as their neighbor, Pierre Duroché: very hands-off winemaking, letting the vineyard speak; mineral-driven and elegant wines. I was a little underwhelmed by their Clos Saint-Denis on the day that I visited and found far more pleasure in their Gevrey-Chambertin Les Goulots, which benefits from a cooler microclimate, or the splendid Gevrey-Chambertin Les Songes, which comes from vineyards in the north of the appellation. Yes, I know the name is a bit of a tongue-twister, but trust me, the wines are worth seeking out.

The palate is medium-bodied with a peppery opening, very spicy in the mouth, moderate depth but, it just needs a little more grip and density on the finish. Drink over three or four years.

The palate is medium-bodied with white pepper sprinkled over the dark berry fruit, hints of Earl Grey towards the nicely composed finish. Excellent.

It has a well defined bouquet with crushed stone infusing the red berry fruit, just a touch of mint developing with time. The palate is medium-bodied with grippy tannin on the entry, just tapering a little towards the finish that just needs to develop a little more flesh. That will surely develop by the time of bottling.

This has a very lively and intense bouquet that actually puts the "Les Jouises" in the shade - vibrant red fruit intermingling with minerals. The palate is medium-bodied with fine grain tannin, well balanced with black fruit mixed with tobacco and graphite, with a sustained finish. Excellent.

This is quite open on the finish but one feels it deserves two or three years before reaching for the corkscrew. Fine.

The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannin, a fine bead of acidity, quite taut and linear with a lightly peppery finish. Superb.

This feels linear and precise, gradually building towards a very minerally and tensile finish. Great persistency here, a superb Gevrey-Chambertin Les Champonnets.

This tends to be picked earlier than the other vineyard in order to obtain freshness. The bouquet is very refined and quite intense with black cherries, boysenberry and hints of liquorice lending an exotic note to the aromas. The palate is mediumbodied with supple tannin, a little foursquare in style (reminding me of a "mini-Latricières!"), but with fine grip on the finish. It will require three or four years in barrel.

Perhaps here I would have liked just a little more delineation for it seems rather "blocky" and heavy on the finish. Afford this 5 to 7 years in bottle - hopefully it will lighten up.
