As such, when we began picking on the 24th of September, we really didn't have much sorting to do. Yields though were off substantially, which is to say between 50 and 60%. Potential alcohols were really pretty at as they ranged from 12.5 to 13.3%. We used between 30 and 60% whole clusters, which is less than usual, and we also used less new wood than usual, or around 35%. Regarding the wines, they're actually better than we expected though it's possible that we were overly influenced by the early press about 2021. While they don't have the ripeness levels of the last few vintages, they're even fresher and arguably truer to the underlying terroir." Tasting note: The fruit is almost sweet in character with its ripe black cherry, plum, anise and whiff of cassis aromas that are trimmed in subtle oak. There is excellent underlying tension to the sleek and lightly stony larger-scaled flavors that display focused power on the firm, serious and lingering finish where the sweetness of the nose resurfaces. I suspect that the sweetness will eventually subside.

Please remember that if Allen is visiting a Domaine to discuss the current 2019 vintage, but retastes a 2018 in bottle, then you will see the producer note is for the 2019 vintage. It makes more sense when you are reading an issue rather than when you are looking in the database. Starting with issue 52 we now add to the producer note "the XX's were revisited in bottle" or a similar explanation to make clear that it is a review in bottle of the previous vintage, even though the producer note covers the current vintage. Still, occasionally errors are created when an issue is uploaded to the database.
