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Domaine Heresztyn-Mazzini

Together with his wife Florence, or "Flo" as she is known, Simon Mazzini has charted this Gevrey producer in a positive direction since taking over the estate in 2012. Since Flo was picking up the kids from school, Mazzini guided me through their latest vintage.

"It was a nice vintage simply because we could do vineyard treatments as we wanted using phytotherapy [the use of plantderived medications in the treatment and prevention of disease.] There was no mildew. At the beginning of May, it was quite hot, so the vigor was high. We left around 6 or 7 buds on the branch. With the storm, we were lucky insofar that we have cover crops that prevented a lot of soil erosion. Did you know that it takes 1,000 years to make one centimeter of soil? Therefore, it is vital to maintain. The storm brought a lot of water, so we were happy as July and August were dry, with just 17mm falling on August 15. We did some green harvesting at the end of July, just Flo and me. Then we started the picking on September 6 in Chambolle-Musigny, a bit later, maybe, as we use whole bunches. We finished up with 42hL/ha on average, the second time more than 40hL/ha since 2017. Just the Clos Village required a little adjustment."

2022 Clos Saint-Denis Grand Cru

Color: **Red**

The 2022 Clos Saint-Denis Grand Cru is aged half in new oak with 70% to 80% whole bunches. The welldefined bouquet offers wonderful mineral-laden red berry fruit, with a hint of savoriness/meat juices in the background. The palate is medium-bodied with fine tannins, very harmonious and smooth. It gently builds in the mouth toward a lightly spiced finish. Very fine.

Matured with 50% whole bunches, the 2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Goulots 1er Cru has a complex, engaging bouquet: a mixture of red and black fruit, white pepper and fennel. The palate is medium-bodied with fine-grain tannins, very elegant in style, and beautifully balanced as it fans out towards the finish. Impressive in terms of precision, a Gevrey that really benefitted from its cooler microclimate.

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2022 Morey-Saint-Denis Les Millandes 1er Cru

Color: **Red**

The 2022 Morey-Saint-Denis Les Millandes 1er Cru includes 60% whole bunches this year. It offers blackberry and raspberry fruit, white pepper and light peppermint aromas on the nose that gradually cohere in the glass. The palate is medium-bodied with grainy tannins, good depth and vitality. The tang of Japanese nori is quite strong towards the long lingering finish. It needs a little more precision overall, but it's still a well-crafted Morey-Saint-Denis.

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2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Champonnet 1er Cru

Color: **Red**

The 2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Champonnet 1er Cru, which suffered minor hail damage in July, includes 60% whole bunches and matured in 20% new oak. It has a slightly reductive bouquet that just misses the finesse of the Les Goulots. The palate is better, with blood orange-infused red fruit and gentle grip, growing spicy towards the finish with quite a long fig-tinged aftertaste. Excellent.

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2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes

Color: **Red**

The 2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes was cropped at 41hL/ha, one of the earlier vineyards picked. Blended with just over 50% whole bunches, it offers wild berry fruit, peppercorns and a dash of white pepper. The palate is medium-bodied with fine-grain tannins. It's a gentle, lilting Gevrey with a poised, persistent finish. Understated, but classy.

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2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Jouises Vieilles Vignes

Color: **Red**

The 2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Jouises Vieilles Vignes is matured in 20% new oak with 80% whole bunches. The stems work really well here - nicely defined, very fresh, a little tertiary at first - not intense fruit, but not overwhelmed by the stems. The medium-bodied palate offers supple tannins and fine acidity, very harmonious, finishing with a dash of spice. Kind of old-school Gevrey in the best sense of that expression.

The 2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Songes Vieilles Vignes contains a r es. This Sian Out has a much tighter bouquet than the Les Jouises, bashful at the moment, with your your your and right earthy scents. The palate is medium-bodied with pliant tannins. It's quite a fleshy Gevrey, but it lacks some complexity towards the finish. Drink over the next 8-10 years.

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2022 Chambolle-Musigny Village

Color: Red

The 2022 Chambolle-Musigny Village, a blend of Bas Doix and Les Echanges, has a lovely bouquet, the 25% new oak neatly integrated, likewise the 60% whole bunches. The medium-bodied palate has smooth tannins and mainly red berry fruit with a dash of white pepper and clove. It may need to develop more complexity towards the finish. Fine, but I hope it gains a bit more personality by the time of bottling.

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2022 Côte de Nuits Villages Queue de Hareng

Color: Red

The maiden 2022 Côte de Nuits Villages Queue de Hareng (which translates to herring's tail) includes 60% whole bunches. It has more fruit intensity than the Bourgogne Rouge: raspberry, light red cherry aromas and a pastille-like purity. The palate is medium-bodied with pliant tannins, a little powdery in texture with a simple yet fresh, sprightly finish. Fine.

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2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Clos Village

Color: Red

The 2022 Gevrey-Chambertin Clos Village has a tight bouquet that misses a bit of cohesion and depth. The palate is medium-bodied, the 60% whole bunches lending pepperiness and spice. It is tight towards the finish with a touch of citrus fruit and a hint of toffee apple on the aftertaste.

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2022 Bourgogne Pinot Noir

Color: Red

The 2022 Bourgogne Pinot Noir comes from a single parcel and was de-stemmed. The light bouquet offers earthy red fruit that requires a little more fruité. The palate is medium-bodied with sharp acidity on the entry. It just needs a little more body and depth, especially on the finish.
